



Lending Library

Virtual Training Series

Virtual Session 1: Creating Partnerships with Families



DATE: September 11 **6:00-8:00 pm via Zoom**
Participants will have an opportunity to identify and describe their own emotional responses (protective urges) and how they can use the PITC Four-Step Process to create positive relationships with families.

Virtual Session 2: Understanding Children's Behavior



DATE: October 2 **6:00-8:00 pm via Zoom**
Participants will have an opportunity to explore the connection between social-emotional development and the possible causes of behavior as well as strategies for responding to behavior with infants and toddlers in group care settings.

Virtual Session 3: Caregiving Routines as Curriculum

Participants will have an opportunity to examine how caregiving routines lead to enhanced relationships between the caregiver and child and create natural learning opportunities for the children in their care.

Participants will have an opportunity to explore the key elements of socialization and guidance with infants and toddlers and identify positive socialization techniques to strengthen their work with children.

schools to be more community-focused and equitable. Partnerships with local community groups are necessary to build successful UPK programs.

The **Calaveras Child Care Council** is funded to form a local workgroup to plan for UPK options in a **mixed delivery system** along with workforce development, in Calaveras County. Mixed Delivery systems offer a variety of early learning and care settings to allow parents and guardians an authentic choice to meet the needs of their families. The local UPK Mixed Delivery workgroup will identify program types available to families and will develop clear access and information about these options.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES Affecting Child Care

There is currently a lot going on in the Legislature that pertains to child care. Follow this [link](#) to search for each Bill, for more details...

- **SB 2** - related to concealed carry permits, prohibits firearms within child care facility (in building and parking area).
- **AB 51** - would support effective and equitable funding of child care providers and just transition as TK is implemented.
- **AB 185** - effective 9/27/22, related to child care license ratios, children enrolled in TK now considered school-aged.
- **AB 310** - related to CalWorks, would provide parents with support to ensure economic security.
- **SB 380** - would require plan to change reimbursement rates to an alternative methodology, and evaluate cost of providing care. Methodology would be updated regularly to account for rising costs in care.
- **AB 596** - to transition providers to a single cost based reimbursement rate, suspending family fees until an equitable sliding scale is established, also funding providers using enrollment based contract.
- **AB 605** - approved 8/1/23, transition to single license for all existing licenses will be delayed. Community Care Licensing will clarify in a PIN.
- **AB 1038** - would codify unified practices for FCCHEN in a standardized framework.
- **SB 1044** - updated Labor Code, employer: emergency condition: retaliation.
- **AB 2131** - effective 1/1/24, elimination of the "toddler component" in Health & Safety Code.
- **AB 2806** - for state-funded programs, expulsion and suspension procedures.
- **AB 2827** - Inclusive Early Education expansion program.

Updates from Community Care Licensing


1) As part of the [Inspection Process Project \(IPP\)](#), Community Care Licensing has developed the **Compliance and Regulatory Enforcement (CARE) Tools** for use in the Child Care Program. The CARE Tools will be used by Licensing Program Analysts (LPAs) when conducting inspections in licensed child care facilities. The CARE Tools focus CCL's efforts in the three IPP priority areas: Prevention, Compliance and Enforcement. Click link [here](#), and scroll down to "CARE Tools for Child Care Facilities."
