Financial Support for Tuition and Books
ELC professionals can request assistance for their early childhood education-related educational expenses. Funding is available until no longer available and/or May 31, 2026.

Academic Education Stipends
Stipends ranging from \$400 to \$900 for completing coursework within or related to early childhood education and/or renewing, maintaining or upgrading their Child Development Permit.

Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential Stipend
Professionals who earn a CDA credential can receive a \$300.

Culturally Diverse Books and Materials
Attendees of dual-language workshops will receive culturally diverse books or materials.

ECE Mentorship Program
Participants in mentor programs at local colleges can receive up to a \$500 stipend upon completion of 1,000 hours of on-the-job training.

Expanding License to Include Toddler, Infants, and/or Overnight and Weekend Care
Stipend amounts will vary.

APPLE VOLCANOS


- Apple Volcanoes are a fun fall science activity where kids create a fizzy eruption inside a hollowed-out apple. Simply scoop out the top of an apple, fill it with baking soda, add a few drops of food coloring and dish soap, then pour in vinegar to make it erupt with foamy bubbles. It's a hands-on way to explore chemical reactions using seasonal materials!



PUMPKIN PAINTING

- Pumpkin Painting is a fun, mess-free twist on traditional carving that lets kids get creative with colors, patterns, and designs. Using washable paints, children can turn their pumpkins into silly faces, spooky creatures, or autumn masterpieces—perfect for decorating indoors or out, and safe for all ages!





- Leaf Jumpers is a beautifully written and illustrated picture book that celebrates the magic of fall through the eyes of curious children. With poetic, rhythmic text by Carole Gerber and warm, vibrant illustrations by Leslie Evans, the book introduces young readers to the colorful world of autumn leaves. Each page gently teaches about different leaf types and trees—like maple, oak, and birch—while capturing the joy of children playing among the falling leaves. It's both educational and playful, making it a perfect seasonal read for early learners or a classroom story time. A delightful blend of science and storytelling! Legislative Updates

Affecting the Early Learning & Child Care Field



- The usual **Cost-of-Living Adjustment** for child care and preschool programs is suspended for the 2025–26 fiscal year. Instead, the



- **California is investing over \$150 million to create 12,000+ new child care and preschool slots,**

\$29.5 million that would have gone to COLA is being reallocated to launch the single rate system. COLA will return in 2026–27.

along with additional funding for emergency child care and family support services. The focus is on expanding access, improving quality, and supporting providers through policy reforms like enrollment-based funding and reduced administrative burdens.

Creating Brave Spaces

Disrupting Implicit Bias in Early Care and Education



Trauma Responsive and Resilience Building for Early Childhood Educators Training Module 100

The Trauma Responsive and Resilience Building training series is designed to support early childhood educators and providers serving children ages 3 through 8 years old. The training is designed to support the early childhood workforce to be trauma informed and equipped with the concrete skills and knowledge to create nurturing, responsive and healing engaged programs for children who have been impacted by trauma and traumatic stress. This training series will support ECE providers working in a range of settings and environments with young children and for individuals working in infrastructure organizations on behalf of young children and families.

Module 100: Overview of Trauma and Key Trauma-Responsive Practices for Early Childhood Providers

Part 1: Mon. October 6, 2025 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm

Part 2: Tues. October 7, 2025 1:00 pm – 4:00 pm

Description:

Trauma-Responsive and Resilience Building Practices for Early Childhood Providers provides an overview on the neurobiology of trauma, the impact of toxic stress on a child and adult and introduces the science of resilience and neuroplasticity. Participants will walk away understanding the difference between a challenging behavior and trauma trigger. The training will guide early child educators and providers and early educators working with infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and early elementary aged children to understand trauma as well as its impact on young children's brains, behavior, learning, and development. The training introduces a range of trauma-responsive and resilience building teaching strategies they can use in their early childhood programs to create strength-based environments that support children's health, healing, and resiliency.
