### SOLAR OVEN S'MORES



Using a recycled pizza box, foil, plastic wrap, and black paper, children can build a simple oven that captures the sun's heat to melt chocolate and marshmallows between graham crackers. It's a hands-on summer activity that combines science and snacks!

- Body Tracing with Sidewalk Chalk is a fun and creative way for kids to turn themselves into works of art! 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

# Legislative Updates

## Affecting the Early Learning & Child Care Field



- **AB 753:** Effective July 1, 2026, this bill would allow preschool teachers two years from their hire date to obtain their necessary credentials, provided they meet specific conditions. This aims to address workforce shortages by offering flexibility in credentialing timelines.



- Starting September 2025, California will fully implement **Universal TK** for all children turning four by September 1. As of now, the 2025–26 state budget allocates \$3.9 billion for this expansion, including \$1.5 billion to reduce student-to-adult ratios from 12:1 to 10:1 in TK classrooms.

## Trainer Certification

Approximately half of all U.S. children under the age of three have a regular child care arrangement creating a significant need for high-quality, responsive care.

PITC builds capacity to improve high-quality infant and toddler care through engaging professional development in the following areas:

- \* Social-Emotional Growth & Socialization
- \* Group Care
- \* Learning & Development
- \* Culture, Family, & Providers

The goal of PITC remains constant: to help infant and toddler care teachers and providers recognize and implement crucially important relationship-based practices and design care environments that are responsive to infants, toddlers, and their families.

### PITC Trainer Certification

The Trainer Institute features a blend of engaging virtual sessions with faculty and online learning experiences with a community of peers.

#### In 2025-26

- \* 30-minute pre-enrollment orientation
- \* Exploration of a topic on the online platform during the launch week to facilitate the development of a certification activity with the support of your peers and your facilitator
- \* One facilitated 2-hour Learning Experience Plan session (with multiple times to choose from)
- \* 90-minute optional module opening sessions to highlight resources, climate of care, and training strategies for each module
